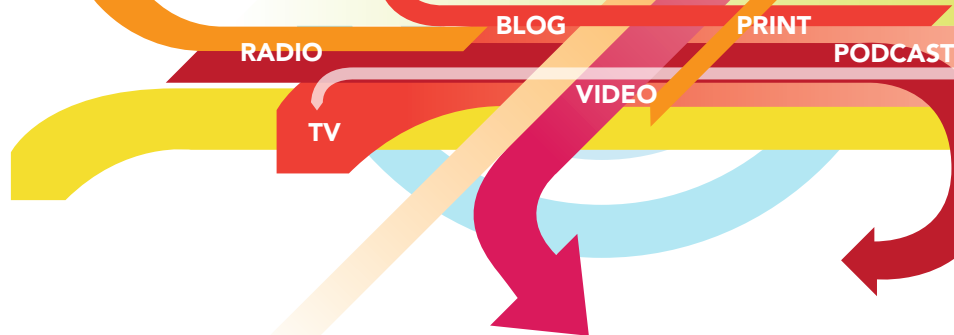


# VOICE IT IN BRUSSELS!



**Be one of 6 young journalists**  
to cover the **Global Youth Anti-Corruption Forum**  
in Brussels in May 2010!

## Eligibility

1. Journalists under 35 years of age as of May 27, 2010.
2. Proven interest in governance, anti-corruption, and accountability.
3. English proficiency.
4. Able to cover events and generate high-quality products in a short time frame.

## Application Materials

1. Full CV and an 800-word description of your intellectual/social values, your previous works, and your specific contribution to these works.
2. Two references from your employer/press association/university supporting your application. If you are a freelance journalist, two more samples of your work other than mentioned below are required.
3. For **Print/Online Journalists** (print/online publications or blogs) — Please provide 3 articles or reports (more than 3 will not be reviewed), including dates and titles of the publications. An English translation must accompany material published in other languages.  
  
For **Broadcast Journalists** (radio, television, podcast) — Please provide three samples of your work (maximum 3 minutes), plus a brief, written description of the material. A summary or transcription in English must accompany material in other languages.
4. Create a journalistic story using your choice of media that is no more than 500 words or 3 minutes in length on how youth can be effective agents of change against corruption, and for the promotion of accountable government. Be creative!
